

Pro Bono contributions

Southmead Development Trust

We provided interior design services to transform the Trust's Greenrooms building into a versatile, accessible venue for community use. This pro bono project, funded by the central government's Youth Investment Fund, had a strong focus on creating benefits for children and young people. The refresh included a multi-functional bookable hall for events, therapy rooms, and updated WC facilities. The ground floor was painted white throughout and the amenities were modernised.


A key component of the renovation was the construction of a level entrance to the ground floor, ensuring barrier-free access to the building for individuals with mobility challenges. In addition, the entire ground floor was reglazed, bringing in an abundance of natural light and creating an open, airy atmosphere. The updated glazing not only improved the building's aesthetics but also enhanced its energy efficiency, ensuring watertightness.




